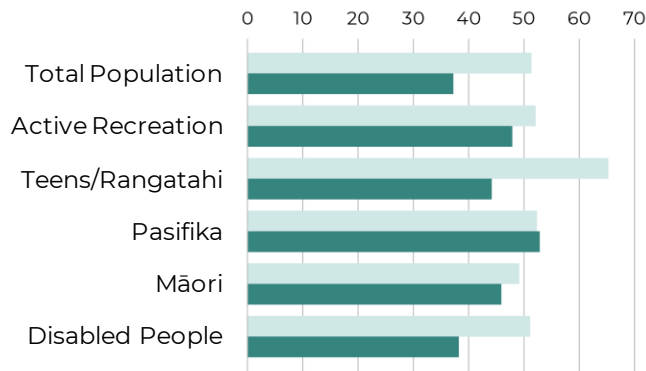


Integrity in Sport and Recreation



Involvement

Over half of the New Zealand population is involved with a Sport or Active Recreation organisation (**51%**) with the highest among Teens/Rangatahi (**65%**)



Member of a Team, Club or Organisation
Volunteer, Administrator or parent involved in a Club

Experiences

38% of people have **experienced** some form of misconduct or integrity issue previously

45% of people were **aware** of integrity issues occurring within sport and recreation organisations

Importance

84% of people believe that integrity is crucial in ensuring a safe, fair and inclusive environment for all participants

83% of people believe integrity is important for future participation

9 out of **10** parents consider integrity when enrolling their children into activities and would consider removing their child if they observed misconduct

Responsibility

64% of people are supportive of the formation of an independent government agency for integrity in sport and recreation

77% of people understand that they have personal accountability for sustaining a safe and fair environment within sport and recreation organisations

Trust

46% of people have a lack of trust in sport and recreation organisations to handle integrity issues.

Raising an Issue

Only **15%** of people took action after experiencing an integrity issue

2 out of **5** people who experienced an issue didn't know how to raise it

Of the **3** out of **5** people who did know how to raise an issue **62%** indicated that it had been resolved

Different audience priorities

Bullying, sexual harassment and racism, were the three most prominent issues identified for the Total Population, however the priorities differed by audience
